HOW TO CLEAN ANILINE LEATHER

Aniline leather is prized for its natural beauty — every mark tells a story. Regular, gentle care helps maintain its luxurious look and soft feel over time.

1. Dust & Surface Dirt (Regular Care)

- · Use: Soft, dry cloth or vacuum with a brush attachment
- Method: Gently wipe or vacuum to remove dust and debris. Avoid pressing too hard, as aniline leather is absorbent and delicate.

2. Spot Cleaning

- · Use: Distilled water and a clean, soft cloth
- Method: Lightly dampen the cloth never soak. Dab the spot gently (don't rub). Let it air dry naturally. Aniline leather may darken temporarily as it dries.

3. Deeper Cleaning (Occasional)

- · Use: Cleaner specifically designed for aniline or unprotected leather
- · Example:
- Leather Master Soft Cleaner

Method: Apply with a soft cloth or sponge, gently
working into the leather in a circular motion. Do not
over-wet. Wipe off excess and allow to dry completely.
Always test a hidden area.

4. Conditioning (As Needed)

- Use: Water-based leather conditioner made for aniline hides
- · Example:

– Leather Protection Cream

 Method: Apply sparingly with a clean cloth. Let absorb, then gently buff. Helps nourish the leather and resist staining.

5. Avoid Using

- Household cleaners, ammonia, or alcohol-based
 products they will damage or discolor the hide
- · Excess water, direct heat, or blow dryers
- · Abrasive cloths or scrubbing can strip or stain the surface
