HOW TO CLEAN OIL PULL-UP LEATHER

CARESS; CLASSICO; PALMA; MUSTANG

Oil pull-up leather is meant to shift, evolve, and gain character. Its surface may mark easily — but it's built to bounce back. With occasional care, it rewards you with a rich patina and lived-in luxury that only improves over time.

Method: Rub gently over scratches or pressure marks.
 The heat and natural movement help redistribute the oils and restore the uniform tone. This shifting is part of the leather's beauty.

1. Dust & Surface Dirt (Regular Care)

- · Use: Soft, dry cloth or horsehair brush
- Method: Gently wipe or brush along the grain to remove dust and light debris. Regular maintenance keeps the surface looking rich and conditioned.

2. Spot Cleaning

- · Use: Damp cloth (distilled water is best)
- Method: Lightly moisten the cloth never soak. Dab
 the spot gently in a circular motion. Allow to air dry fully.
 Temporary darkening may occur but typically blends back
 in as it dries.

3. Restore Marks & Oil Character

· Use: Clean fingers, soft cloth, or a bit of heat from your palm

4. Conditioning (As Needed)

- · Use: Oil-based conditioner made for pull-up or oily leathers
- · Examples:
- <u>– Oleosa Pull-Up Cream</u>
- Wax-On Conditioner
- · Method: Spot test first. Apply a small amount with a soft cloth, allow it to absorb, and then buff. Enhances suppleness and revives the deep, rich tones.

5. Avoid Using

- Harsh chemicals, alcohol-based cleaners, or household sprays
- · Abrasives, stiff brushes, or anything that strips the oils
- · Over-wetting or exposing to direct heat, which can cause drying or discoloration
